# Wellbeing:

Creativity is linked to positive mental health and opportunities for improving wellbeing. We have been working with a Social Prescriber to host a portrait painting course.

# **Community Cohesion:**

is improved through the power of art to connect, inspire and generate empathy.

It is ensured by bespoke community programming and stakeholder engagement.

# **Covid Recovery:**

Redwing's activities contribute to the arts sector's and Penzance's post Covid recovery.



The COVID pandemic required the closure of the venue and severely curtailed activities during 2020. The gallery was, however, able to mount open call online exhibitions for the first time, developed in response to the social isolation caused by the pandemic.

Throughout the pandemic Redwing's Community Larder continued to collect excess supermarket food and non-food items and distribute them at the gallery entrance.



The gallery commissioned a local carpenter to create recycled pallet planters for the exterior of the building. Nearby residents from Housing Association properties who did not have their own gardens began tending the plants during the pandemic. This increased their sense of ownership and pride in their local area.





Penzance is one of the most deprived parishes in England.

Many of our regular community live in isolated rural areas of Penwith and travel into Redwing by bus or cycling. Free activities at Redwing, such as the weekly volunteer-led Tuesday art group "How to Paint When You Think You Can't" would be otherwise unaffordable to many members of the local community.

Funding recently awarded by The National Lottery for free "Art in the Open" outdoor art sessions for the local community will increase creative activities on offer and culminate in an exhibition.

Redwing aims to be an inclusive organisation. Its rich diversity of activities aim to enable the broadest range of people to access the Gallery, many of whom attend several times a week.

Research by Lemos & Crane (2015). (Re-imagine: improving access to the arts, galleries and museums for people with learning disabilities. London: City Bridge Trust) suggests there are insufficient dedicated activities, programmes or professional development opportunities for marginalised adults in mainstream arts organisations, museums and galleries.

Redwing aims to redress this whilst deliberately avoiding labelling in terms of individual health, disability or social circumstance.

The programme at Redwing Gallery has evolved over a number of years in response to the community's needs and suggestions. This organic process has resulted in a clear sense of empowerment and ownership by those individuals engaged, leading to a rich dynamic between the Gallery and its communities.



# **Our Contribution**

At the heart of our work is our ability to generate social value and community wealth through the impact of creativity and culture. This impact is delivered not only through the number of artists' livelihoods that can be supported by the provision of exhibition and retail opportunities and creative workspace but also through the power of creative spaces to

increase connectivity, empathy and system change in the communities within which they operate. Thereby contributing to the overall wellbeing and prosperity of the locality.

Employment is a key issue for Penwith, with low employment rates and high levels of joblessness (economic inactivity) rather than high rates of unemployment. Increasingly, the issue to consider is the number of people on benefits such as income support, incapacity benefit or lone parent benefit.



# **Our Approach**

Our Social Outcomes are directly linked to our mission, business plan and strategy.

After the impact of Covid -19 Redwing CICs staff are finding it more difficult to deal with growing demand for its service. Redwing requires urgent investment to increase staff capacity to enable it to continue to deliver its vision of a vibrant and inclusive artistic Penzance.
